Summary of the 56th Meeting RTCA Special Committee 206 Summary of the 52nd Meeting EUROCAE WG-76 Aeronautical Information Services (AIS) and Meteorological (MET) Data Link Services

Executive Summary

The joint RTCA SC-206 / EUROCAE WG-76 Plenary meeting was held during the week of June 10th at AOPA Headquarters in Frederick, Maryland.

- o SG-1 CSC and Other SC Coordination (ISRAs)
 - SG-1 is preparing for the next Combined Surveillance Committee (CSC) meeting
 - SG-1 has finalized the ADS-Wx extended squitter definitions and MOPS verbiage implementing ADS-Wx and will propose ADS-Wx MOPS requirements to the CSC during the June 2019 meeting
 - SG-1 will brief the ICAO Surveillance Panel Aeronautical Surveillance Working Group (ASWG) Technical Subgroup (TSG) meeting in June 2019
 - SG-1 plans to brief the ADS-Wx final message sets to SC-206/WG-76 membership at the September Joint Meeting
 - SG-1 will participate in the ICAO Surveillance Panel, ASWG meeting in September 2019
 - Steve Darr will lead the planning for the Friends and Partners for Aviation Weather (FPAW) Fall Meeting half-day session on Weather from the Flight Deck
 - SG-1 continues to coordinate with:
 - o SC-206, SC-186, and CSC Leadership
 - o Transponder manufacturer representatives,
 - o Interval management team,
 - o Aircraft manufacturers,
 - o National and international wake turbulence teams,
 - o FAA, ICAO, and others.

o SG-5: FIS-B MOPS

- SG-5 is preparing for the release of two new FIS-B Products: Temporary Restricted Areas (TRAs) and Temporary Military Operating Areas (TMOAs)
 - o Revision B of DO-358 will account for these two new FIS-B Products.
- The Preliminary Design Review (PDR) of the TRA/TMOA products is scheduled for September 2019
 - o Prior to the PDR, SG-5 is still meeting regularly to coordinate and work activities not dependent on the Software Design for the TRA/TMOA Products.
- Currently there is a short pause for TRA/TMOA in the SG-5 activity
 - o The FAA is developing a specification for TRA/TMOA NOTAM format and details will be delivered to Harris from the FAA for uplink

- Therefore, SG-5 is awaiting further direction from the FAA
- SG-5 is currently evaluating DO-358A FRAC comments for any items relevant to DO-358B
- o Eldridge Frazier is arranging a briefing from the SBS and NOTAM office
- o SG-6: MASPS
 - SG-6 is continuing to make progress in the development of Service Descriptions associated with DO-364A
 - Working Group 1 (Aeronautical Information) and Working Group 3 (Collaborative Decision Making) are in need of a European individual to co-chair the WG
- System-Wide Information Management (SWIM) Briefing
 - There were two briefings this week regarding US and European SWIM
 - The US SWIM is an Air-Ground service whereas European SWIM is primarily a ground-ground service

- 3. Review and Approval of Meeting Agenda
 - Meeting agenda for this week was approved
- 4. Review and Acceptance of Minutes of WG-76 Meeting 51/SC-206 Meetings 54 and 55
 - Rocky made a motion to accept the Meeting Summaries
 - o Tom Evans seconded the motion
 - There were no objections
 - o The Meeting Summaries were approved
- 5. Action Item Review
 - Action Item 329
 - o This document is still in review and coordination
 - o The draft version has been provided to the SC-206 membership
 - o This Action Item will remain OPEN
 - Action Item 330
 - Tom Evans reported that Steve Young is contacting the appropriate people to identify an industry presenter
 - Mark Mutchler commented that there is a strong push for on demand mobility for aviation and that this is tied to UAS operations
 - Mark added that he works with Wes Frye and could provide a point of contact if necessary
 - Mark could also get information on UTM and how on-demand mobility could interface with the NAS
 - o Stephane Dubet indicated that he could have a discussion with WG-44 and obtain a collection of specifications
 - In the latest discussions in Europe, there is some uncertainty in the requirements within that committee
 - o This Action Item will remain OPEN
 - Action Item 331
 - o Eldridge reported that the necessary information has been posted to Workspace
 - o This Action Item can be CLOSED
 - Action Item 332
 - o This Action Item can be CLOSED
 - Action Item 333
 - o This Action Item can be CLOSED
 - Action Item 334
 - o Stephane reported that the WG-104 deliverables were put on Workspace by Alex
 - However, they did not identify any specific document that would be helpful
 - Stephanie indicated that the EUROCONTROL SWIM specifications consist of 3 documents
 - All are available on the internet

- Stephane provided the following url to access the EUROCONTROL SWIM specifications

- o Stephane reported that the Procedures for Air Navigation Services (PANS) is still in draft, so he is limited in his ability to transmit the document at this time
 - However, the PANS may be able to be distributed later in the year
 - Stephane recommended delaying providing the PANS until October
- o Alex noted that requests for ICAO material must go through the Secretariat
- o This Action Item will remain Open until October
- Action Item 335
 - This Action Item will be addressed and closed during the Friday June 14th closing Plenary
- Action Item 336
 - o This Action Item can be CLOSED

- **6.** Industry Coordination
 - EUROCAE WG-104 European SWIM
 - o This briefing will be presented during the Friday, June 14th closing Plenary due to a national holiday in Europe today
 - U.S. SWIM
 - o Reference the <u>System Wide Information Management and Connected Aircraft</u> briefing slides
 - Biruk Abraham provided the briefing
 - o Reference Slide 10
 - Rocky asked if there are airlines participating in SWIFT
 - 1. Rocky is interested in who the United Airlines participant may be
 - 2. Biruk referred Rocky to slide 11 as to which entities are participating
 - o Reference Slide 9
 - Louis asked when "web services" are coming online
 - 1. Biruk responded that this is related to "connected aircraft"
 - Louis asked if Biruk could point him to the concepts for how the collaboration of the information takes place versus the exchange of information
 - 1. Biruk agreed to provide the url to several Use Cases that discuss how the information will be used
 - i. There is ongoing collaboration within the group as to how to provide and use the information
 - Biruk stated that they are working with implementers within the FAA as to how the information will be provided and made operational
 - o Eldridge asked if there are any concepts that will move to the ICAO level
 - Biruk responded in the affirmative
 - 1. They are currently writing the Safety Critical portion of the connected aircraft concept

o Reference Slide 7

- Jim Mills asked about the reference to the service in the cloud solution being for non-NAS use
 - 1. Biruk responded that in some instances, there are FAA-internal processes that are not NAS related
- Jim asked if the NOTAM distribution service is currently part of cloud service
 - 1. Biruk responded not at this time
 - i. That service would be available through the NAS Enterprise Secure Gateway (NESG) via SWIM, but not via the cloud
- Stephane Dubet asked for the difference between an AIS/MET Service in the ground environment versus the AIS/Met Service similar to what is being worked in RTCA/EUROCAE
 - Stephane added that ICAO SWIM is ground to ground
 - Biruk commented that there is a difference between the services
 - 1. They need to recognize the potential services on how the information is handled in the ground to ground environment
 - i. In the air, the messages are streamlined
 - 2. They also need to recognize the operational use base standards and performance metrics and what drives the requirements for ground to air services
 - Biruk added that, from the ICAO Information Management Panel (IMP) perspective, they are developing a set of basic standards for how the information service can be shared with users in a more standardized manner
 - 1. They could be used in a registry
 - 2. Developing those services within RTCA / EUROCAE will help Biruk develop their requirements
- o Louis asked if there is any additional aircraft equipage anticipated
 - Biruk responded that there is no new equipage anticipated at this time
 - 1. However, not everyone is participating
 - 2. Therefore, for those that are equipped, they want to leverage the information

o Reference Slide 10

- Eldridge noted that there are no inflight entertainment providers listed and asked if the concept is looking for airlines to bring their own communications
 - 1. Biruk responded that that is not necessarily the case
 - i. They realize that the airlines are going to work with their individual providers
 - ii. From a SWIFT perspective, they're more interested in how the stakeholders will use the service
 - iii. The airlines are bringing the link providers to the table to participate, however SWIFT is not targeting the link providers specifically

7. Report of Sub-Groups:

- SG-1: CSC and Other SC Coordination (ISRAs)
 - o Reference SG1 Opening Slides June 10, 2019
 - o Steve Darr provided the SG-1 status briefing

- o Madhu Niraula asked if this is providing weather data to the aircraft
 - Steve responded that this is accessing weather data onboard the aircraft
 - Madhu asked why they are not using ADS-C
 - 1. Steve responded that ADS-C has per message costs associated with it that ADS-B does not, and that ADS-B has a higher transmit frequency
 - i. Rocky added that ADS-C is strictly air-to-ground, and this capability needs to be capable of air-to-air
- Mark Libant commented that in the US, Europe, and Canada, the mandate will specify compliance with DO-260B and ED-102A
 - These items will be included in DO-260C for later compliance
 - Mark asked what the expectation is for future compliance with DO-260C
 - 1. Rocky responded that there is no anticipated compliance date at this time
- SG-5: FIS-B MOPS (DO-358B)
 - o Reference SG5 Opening Slides June 10, 2019
 - o Jeremy Garber provided the SG-5 status briefing
 - o Reference Slides 3 and 4
 - Eldridge noted to Jeremy that SG-5 should be tracking to the FRAC Resolution date (September 2020)
 - 1. The current due date is March 2020; therefore this represents a 6-month slip in schedule
 - 2. Eldridge added that they can slip 3 months without a TOR revision
 - i. Therefore, this would require a revision to the TOR
 - ii. Karan concurred
 - Paul Freeman noted his frustration with the lack of industry participation during the DO-358A effort
 - o John Ferrara highlighted his concern over the lack of a baseline
 - The FAA is to specify to Harris the details of their expectations
 - This puts SG-5 in a position to ensure Harris does it correctly
 - 1. It is important that the briefing to SG-5 by the NOTAM office is very detailed on their expectations
 - Eldridge stressed that it is not the responsibility of SG-5 to monitor Harris to ensure they're doing it correctly
 - 1. The SBS office has the responsibility to monitor Harris
 - o Rocky commented that official tasking to SG-5 must come from the PMC
 - And tasking from the PMC has to come through an SC-206 Plenary session
 - o Benoit asked where we are in terms of NOTAM format
 - Stephane responded that there is insight within the ICAO level
 - 1. There are 4 major "threads"; NOTAM being one of them
 - i. They are working on a way to better characterize the NOTAMS and what they are about
 - 1. This is being led by individual within NAV Canada
 - Jim Mills responded that for the US FAA side, the intent is to go to the ICAO NOTAM format
 - 1. The DoD already follows the ICAO NOTAM format
 - Eldridge and Jim agreed to find someone to provide a US NOTAM status briefing during the September Plenary meeting

- Jim added that we need to ensure that the new NOTAMS are backward compatible with the RTCA documents
- o With respect to the leadership of SG-5
 - There was a discussion regarding who would lead SG-5 following Paul Freeman departing as an industry co-chair
 - It was ultimately decided during the Closing Plenary that:
 - 1. Jeremy Garber and John Ferrara will serve as SG-5 co-chairs
 - 2. Amanda Hoprich will continue to support SG-5 as the new document is being developed
- WG-76 and SG-6: MASPS (DO-364A)
 - o Reference SG6 Opening Slides June 10, 2019
 - o Eldridge provided the SG-6 status briefing
 - o Eldridge stressed that they are looking for a European replacement to co-chair WG-1 under SG-6
 - o They are also looking for a European member to co-chair WG-3 under SG-6
 - o Louis Bailey agreed to look for a CDM point of contact / SME to work with Rocky on his CDM efforts
 - o Rocky noted that WG-3 does not have a well-defined objective at this time
 - The TOR is very broad
 - They need to define the application that the cockpit will use to participate in CDM
 - o Eldridge noted that he is working on the internal process to get FAA employees to the September Plenary in Toulouse
 - o Tom Evans asked if there is any additional input from the European side on participation in SG-6 activities
 - Alex responded that they are hoping for a greater participation by Europe in the future

3. Industry Coordination

- EUROCAE WG-104 European SWIM
 - o Reference EUROCAE WG-104 SWIM Activities slide presentation
 - o Oliver Krueger provided the European SWIM briefing
 - o Eldridge asked the difference between EUROCONTROL and EUROCAE
 - EUROCONTROL is responsible for the safety of air navigation in Europe
 - This is an ATC-related organization
 - EUROCONTROL has its own control center and manages airspace traffic in Europe

- EUROCONTROL develops specifications in response to regulatory requirements
- SWIM is a subset of work
- EUROCAE is a standards development organization
- o Reference Slide 4
 - Louis Baily asked if Oliver could provide some insight into why EUROCAE created 3 separate documents
 - These documents are applicable to issues raised within SG-6
 - Oliver responded that there was no specific reason why the 3 documents were broken out
 - The 2nd document could be used by other applications
 - However, all could be included in one specification if necessary
 - Louis added that there is a question within SG-6 as to whether to combine or separate out the material within the MASPS
- Rocky Stone asked if there is any US participation in WG-104 or EUROCONTROL in general
 - Oliver responded that there are no attendees outside of Europe
- o Eldridge commented that the SWIM service interacts with the information source for cockpit, so there is an impact
 - Eldridge asked if Europe is considering an air-ground service similar to the US
 - Oliver responded that they are not working air-ground service
 - They only have the means to work a ground-ground service
 - The operations should be aligned, but that is on the ICAO level
 - i. There is nothing that EUROCAE can do
 - Eldridge asked if there is any research being done with respect to an airground system
 - Oliver responded that he has not been involved in any air-ground system development work
 - Oliver agreed to provide contacts of who may have done airground research
 - A question was asked if there is ongoing harmonization with ICAO
 - Oliver responded in the affirmative
 - Oliver commented that he read a paper from WG-76 where the various services were described and asked if SC-206 plans to define the SWIM services
 - Boris Resnick responded that they are trying to keep the WG-76 services compatible with the SWIM service
 - i. Rocky noted that the Service Descriptions that SC-206 is working are primarily air-ground
 - 1. SWIM is an information sharing service and has to be compatible with SWIM
 - 2. Some services may not involve SWIM, but will "touch" SWIM
 - ii. Rocky added that SC-206 is primarily dealing with information content
 - There is another profile that describes the air-ground technology
- o Oliver agreed to provide a package of relevant docs from EUROCONTROL

- Oliver will provide the information to Alex Engel and Alex will post to the EUROCONTROL and RTCA Workspace
- o Oliver also agreed to provide a copy of his slide presentation

4. SG5 Leadership

- Rocky commented that Paul Freeman had to step down as co-chair of SG-5 due to a new position within Harris
 - o This created an opening in the leadership of SG-5
 - Rocky noted that it is within the purview of the SC-206 leadership to appoint Subgroup leaders
 - o After Paul's departure, Jeremy Garber (Harris) took over and has been doing an outstanding job of co-chairing with John Ferrara
 - o The SC-206 leadership has decided that SG-5 will now be led by John Ferrara and Jeremy Garber
- SG-5 will continue working on DO-358B
 - o However, there is a slight "pause" while SG-5 awaits direction from the FAA

5. Report of Sub-Groups

- SG-1 Reference SG1 Closing Slides June 14, 2019
 - o Ed Johnson provided the briefing
 - o There were no issues raised related to the SG-1 briefing
- SG-6 Reference SG6 Closing Slides June 14, 2019
 - o Eldridge Frazier provided the initial SG-6 remarks
 - o Reference Slide 2
 - Steve commented that the arrows from 2-3 should be bi-directional
 - Eldridge agreed to change the arrows in the graphic
 - o Reference Slide 4
 - Eldridge commented that SG-6 is 3 months behind schedule
 - Eldridge stressed to the participants of WG-1 and WG-2 that they need to support Tammy Flowe and Jim Mills to get something on paper so that biweekly meetings can be spent editing text
 - WG-1 and WG-2 need to develop "straw man" documents for each of their Service Descriptions
 - These WG's should use completed SDs as templates
 - Eldridge would like to have all of the "blue" documents "green" by September
 - For reference, note the following document status color-coding
 - i. Black Done
 - ii. Green Mature
 - iii. Blue Needs Revision
 - iv. Red Needs Input (<70%)
 - Eldridge anticipates that by September, he intends to show plans for developing DO-364A
 - There is a lot of pressure on Bill Carson and Isabela Gheorghisor to develop the OSA/OPA
 - i. However, they cannot begin until the documents are "black"

- Regarding the Collaborative Decision Making (CDM) Service Description portion of the document, Rocky indicated that he is working that effort
 - However, he cannot meet his deadline until early December
- With respect to WG-1, Jim Mills requests moving his bi-weekly meetings to another day
 - Jim agreed to check the calendar and update the WebEx information as necessary
 - Jim reiterated and stressed that he is in need of a European counterpart to cochair WG-1
- **6.** Future Meetings, Plans, and Dates
 - Eldridge commented that it is difficult for the FAA representatives to travel internationally twice in same year
 - o Therefore, the 2020 dates and meeting venues need to be discussed further
 - Alex Engel agreed to look into the availability of the EUROCAE facility in September 2020
 - o Alex noted that the week of September 14th is unavailable at EUROCAE
 - Tom Evans agreed to look at the availability of the NASA facility in Houston to host the December 2020 Joint Meeting
 - Reference the March 2020 meeting, Alex agreed to coordinate with Karol Molnar for the week of March 2nd
 - Reference the June 2020 meeting, **Eldridge and Tammy agreed to coordinate with NCAR** (Boulder) for the week of June 8th

- Tom Evans made the comment that DO-358B and DO-364A are looking to slip and may have to revise their dates
 - o Eldridge noted that SG-6 is already 3 months behind on DO-364 and anticipate needing another 3 months
 - Therefore, they are going to have to request a 6 month slip to June 2021
 - o Jeremy Garber commented that DO-358B will slip 3 months
 - March 2020 will now become June 2020
