**BACKGROUND**: The United States Centers for Disease Control began tracking infections from a new respiratory disease in early 2020. According to the CDC<sup>1</sup>

From January 21 through February 23, 2020, public health agencies detected 14 U.S. cases of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), all related to travel from China.

As the year progressed, travel restrictions were implemented by nations to stop the spread of the disease. The aviation industry recognized the seriousness of the threat of infection and moved to restore confidence of the traveling public that the aircraft in which they travel are safe from transmission vectors for the disease.
